Saturday Night is Africa Night

The Convention coincides with Emmanuel's annual Africa Night – the evening the clocks fall back, giving us an extra hour of sleep. This is one of the biggest events of Emmanuel's year. Africa Night is a fundraiser, offered, organized and put on by Emmanuel's African members – an evening of African food, music, and dance to raise funds for a project in Africa. Our African community are hard at work planning and preparing for this larger-than-usual event. This will be a wonderful occasion to end the final day of meetings. Your registration fee includes the entry ticket of CHF20 which includes the meal. All proceeds from the entry tickets go toward

the project, as most of the food is donated. Drinks, however, are extra, with profits going to the project.

It is traditional for many of us to wear African dress or shirts, so if you have something from Africa, do bring it. If you don't, and would like to extend your wardrobe, African shirts in various sizes will be available at the Convention on Friday at a cost of CHF20. Again, all proceeds over cost go toward the project. (While customary, African dress is not required, however, so do not feel obligated.)

The Project this year is to continue to provide support to International Peace Initiatives (IPI), an NGO in Meru, Kenya, founded and directed by Dr Karambu Ringera. IPI is a local initiative which empowers women, educates and inspires orphans and is creating a thriving, resilient and sustainable community. IPI also sponsors New Generation Leadership conferences for youth to promote peace and ethical leadership. Emmanuel has provided support to the program in the past, and Dr Ringera visited us this past May.

Located in an area suffering from increasing drought and famine, International Peace Initiatives' current project is to seek to distribute/share clean water for drinking, domestic and farm use to 15,000 Kithoka Community Members. The main objectives are to provide clean water, improve food production for food sustainability and sovereignty, and reduce waterborne diseases. To be able to carry out this project they require funding to set up a 45,000 liter water tank, construct a water tower at Kithoka Amani Community Home and pipes to supply water to different homesteads and identified institutions. Emmanuel's aim is to be able to provide a substantial amount toward the total cost of over USD 10,000.

The entire Emmanuel Community look forward to your joining us at Emmanuel for Africa Night and the Closing Eucharist.
